General Information

Welcome

Welcome to our farm and our 8th TUI FARM FOLK FESTIVAL, which is being hosted by Steve & Carol Rose. Here is some basic information for you.

Children's Entertainment:

This year we have Holly & Poppy Norton entertaining the children. There will be all sorts of events planned by them, which will be advised once the festival has begun. Rest assured, there will be plenty of action.

Our Neighbours:

Tui Festival happens each year because of the permission/approval of our neighbours and any one of them could make a complaint about this festival and have us shut down. Please respect our neighbours, they allow us to hold this festival each year. PLEASE!!!! Always drive slowly on Tui Road - keep your speed to under 20kms per hour and keep the dust down - it's only for 500m!!

Camping:

Often the mix of late night carousers and early morning risers can be problematical, so here are a few suggestions. **Attention all-night-jammers, reprobates and sleeper-inners** - you are advised to camp in the area from below the large pine-tree and around towards the main marquee.

Attention families, early-to-bedders and early risers - there is a really quiet area straight across from the kitchen/amenities block. You will see a concrete water trough and two port-a-loos beside a gate. Go through the gate and down into a small, sheltered and very quiet paddock. It is also fairly quiet up on the top level. Please note that the main marquee paddock is a designated noise-zone. We won't accept any complaints about noise from anyone camping in this paddock. Be Warned!!

Shade Cloth Area/Amenities Block:

Please do not camp in or too close to this area, as it will be the focus of late night jams and you will certainly not get much sleep here. The amenities block includes a kitchen with cold water tap for dishes, a hot shower and two hand-basins. The shower is heated from the coal range, so please keep showers to 5 minutes maximum, so that there will be enough hot water to go round.

WARNING: The water from this coal range is scalding hot and children should be supervised in the showers, at all times. Never, ever leave your children alone in the shower unless they are old enough to know about hot water. There is a garden tap by the hand basins for filling buckets and water containers. There is another tap at the concrete water tank above the family paddock.

Blackboard Concerts:

Performers, please keep an eye on the list and be in the green room (the tent behind the marquee), tuned up and ready to perform. You need to be in there and ready to go when the performer before you goes on. This will speed things up and help everyone "get a go". If you are not in the green room, ready to go, you will be put to the back of the list and may miss out if we are running late.

TIP: **Please** tune your instrument before going on stage. Out of tune instruments are painful to the ear!!

Freezers:

We have four freezers for your use which are located in the implement sheds up by the house - follow the orange road cones up to the top level. We recommend that you keep your food in a separate bag. It gets pretty full in the freezers and shopping bags tend to spill their contents. Please note that any glass bottles will be removed and placed outside the freezer. Glass bottles tend to break when frozen (this is NOT a beer chiller!)

General Information Continued

Rubbish:

In the past, we have taken all rubbish down to the re-cycle at Tapawera, however this facility is no longer available. In light of this, we ask that you place all “organic” rubbish (scraps and stuff) in the buckets outside the loos in the family paddock or the ones outside the kitchen. On arrival, you will be given a rubbish bag and we ask that you collect the balance of your rubbish yourselves and take it away with you. Please let us know if you need another bag.

Swimming Hole:

Follow the orange marker cones from the barn area through the paddocks to the swimming hole. Around about a five minute walk. There are some prickles on the way, make sure you and your children are wearing good footwear. Please don't use soaps or detergents in the water as this is a trout-breeding river. Parents, please be sure that your children are supervised at all times. We can accept no responsibility for any accidents that may occur on this property. Please do not cross the river and enter the neighbours properties on the other side. The river is our boundary. Note that this is the only area open for swimming. Any other stream is out of bounds as they provide us with our water and I'm sure none of us want to drink your swimming water!!

Supermarket/Take-aways/Alcohol/Ice:

All of these are available at Tapawera, which is 20 minutes away. If you are going to the shop for any supplies, perhaps you could check to see if others need anything.

Water Supply:

There are two taps for filling buckets and water containers. One is by the hand-basins in the amenities block and the other is straight across the paddock at the concrete water-trough (by the porta-loos). All of the water to this property comes from Donald Creek (the small stream behind the amenities block). This stream is out of bounds to everybody, please obey this request. This water system has been serving this property quite safely for many years, but if you are concerned about river water, then please boil it prior to drinking. Again, we can take no responsibility.

Wasps:

The wasps can be pretty bad at Tui. If you get stung, try toothpaste to take the sting out (grandma's remedy - it really works!!)

Emergency Telephone:

There is a telephone in a “kitchen tidy bin” up by the gate on the way to the freezers. Please respect the use of this phone, it is intended for urgent/emergency calls only. There is a toll-bar on this phone and you will need to get a phone card from us or use your own Telecom calling card to make calls. Note that Nelson is a free call from here but Motueka is a toll-call (silly aye?)

First-Aid:

There is an emergency first-aid kit on the shelf above the kitchen sink.

Finally, thanks to you all for coming and supporting this eighth Nelson festival. It's because of you that we're able to do this again and can, hopefully, do it for many years to come.
